Our Focus

In partnership with the Department of Communities and Justice, the CCCC focus on the following cohorts within our community

- Children and young people at risk of disengagement from school, family and community
- Children 0-5 years old and their families
- Young parents with known vulnerabilities or who are experiencing a number of hardships
- Aboriginal children, young people, families and communities.

We will look to establish with service providers, a network that provides a range of life skills and development courses and assists new parents to cope with a variety of services and strategies.
